To The Strategic Planning Policy Service,

On Monday 12<sup>th</sup> August 2019 I attended the Preferred Strategy Consultation at Llanrhos Old School. The drop in session was well attended by local residence that were all showing great interest in the presentation. Gaging the mood the only people in favour of the proposals for Llanrhos were the council representatives.

On reading all the information I came to the conclusion this was **NOT** a consultation more what Conwy Council will be putting into Conwy (RLDP) 2018 – 2033.

As you are aware the village of Llanrhos can expect at least 250 Houses, land for Offices, a new Primary School, Allotments and Recreation Spaces which <u>WILL</u> be phased in from 2024 – 2031. This amount of development will increase air pollution which will cause deterioration in air quality and traffic noise. How this will help Llanrhos where part of your Mission Statement states improvement to air quality and environment. This proposal fails on both counts.

The main reason I moved to Llanrhos was the lack of pollution and the traffic levels as I suffer from angina which is affected by traffic pollution. Not only will the residences of this new development cause an increase in traffic this will also cause an increase in delivery traffic, public transport increases and construction traffic and noise. The Marl Lane 110 house development which is not that far away will also have an impact on the area.

Looking at the presentation I noticed no mention of a Doctors Surgery or Dentist when we all know surgeries are closing within the County and NHS dentists are in short supply. THE LOCAL Hospital as you are aware, if you need an A and E department does not have this facility. You have to travel for 30 minutes (assuming the A55 is clear) to either Bodelwyddan or Bangor. Llandudno hospital only deals with <u>MINOR INJURIES</u> and is <u>NOT</u> a 24 Hour service. Before embarking on large developments within the county the infrastructure needs to be addressed for the wellbeing and safety of the existing residence and visitors. A 24 Hour A and E at Llandudno Hospital should be the number one priority not large housing estates, skate parks and more pollution and noise,

May I also point out that this area of Llanrhos is predominately retired residence. The new development and the primary school will double the size of this end of Llanrhos and in consequence alter the dynamics of the area, and not for the good.

In conclusion I wish to strongly oppose The Local Development Plan 2018 – 2033. This development is too large and in the wrong place and would be detrimental to all the existing residence in the area.
