I wish to express my great concerns in respect of the proposal by the local authority that some 450 houses be built between Penllys Lane and Llanellian Road, Old Colwyn.

At this point in time Old Colwyn struggles already to meet the current needs of its' residents.

For the following reasons I believe the proposed plan, and the foreseeable likely outcomes of such a development, will be detrimental in the extreme to Old Colwyn, its' community and to the quality of life for its' residents:

• TRAFFIC:

The present traffic situation in Abergele Road, Coed Coch Road, the "Marine" roundabout and the "knock-on" effect on all roads in Old Colwyn are difficult already. Extra traffic generated by the proposed development will affect driving difficulties (& pedestrians) to an extreme degree, there being no physical space on existing roads to cope with an increase in a successful manner, it is likely to pose dangers to drivers & pedestrians alike.

Access to existing shops (& trade) in Old Colwyn will be restricted adversely with the accompanying

probability that trade will suffer considerably.  
Much has been done in more recent times to improve access etc. — These benefits would be lost to traders & residents alike. Car parking in the areas of Old Colwyn is at a premium already.

Penllys Lane is not suitable for the creation of a road which would pose dangerous driving & pedestrian conditions in the area.

Children attending school/s locally would experience dangerous conditions.

Road safety issues in general would become too many to countenance, or with which to cope; serious injuries & fatalities are likely to occur.

• ~~ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH:~~

The area of Old Colwyn has only one medical health-care / surgery at present & is under great pressure already.

An increase in the population of Old Colwyn cannot be coped with by the surgery.

It appears Drs. at the practice were not consulted about the proposal & likely effects upon the service/s which could be provided? (At the very least that would have been courteous!).

The quality of care for local residents will be affected adversely.

- "Soundness" of the Proposals:
  - Most residents of Old Colwyn unaware of the development plans.
  - Local Health Board not consulted, nor was Cadwgan Surgery.
  - Local Head Teachers were not made aware of the proposals, the potential increase in pupil numbers or changes to existing catchment areas in the context of financial difficulties.

Having regard to all the reasons listed & outlined in this letter, I wish to register my objections to the proposed housing development.

The proposed site for the development is in open countryside - the reason for previous applications having been refused.

• EDUCATION:

Budget cuts & staff redundancies have taken place already. An increase in demand for places at school/s, extra staffing (in all areas) to cope with demand; less support for pupils requiring extra help - will all be part of the outcomes from higher demand for school places. Education of pupils, in all age groups, will be affected adversely. Budget cuts for 2019/2012 are predicted. How can it be thought that the local authority will be in a position to provide all the extra demands & facilities?

The proposed housing development plan would put pressure upon resources pressurised already.

• ENVIRONMENT:

The proposed plan will have a significant effect & impact upon local wild-life & the general environment.

Over 526 species of mammals, plants, birds, insects are to be found within a radius of 100km of Penllys Lane.

There is an increased awareness in society that we all must take & observe an ~~for~~ increased level of interest in, & care for, support of our environment - for ourselves & following generations.
